**EFFECTIVE AUGUST 7<sup>TH</sup> DIAL '6' TO PLACE AN OFF CAMPUS CALL** - On August 7, 2000, the "dial out" number changed to '6'. As of that date, rather than dialing "9 + phone number" to reach someone outside the University, you will dial "6 + phone number". Historically, the Eastern New Mexico University telephone system has used the digit '9' to secure an outside (off campus) telephone line. Due to the recent upgrade in the University 911 emergency system, using '9' of dial-out is no longer practical. This change applies to all off campus calls including long distance. Also, please remember to change all telephone speed-dial numbers and fax machines to reflect this change. Thank you for your cooperation in making this smooth transition. ## Personnel News Briefs

**Dr. Gretchen Foley**, assistant professor of music, presented a paper entitled: "Structural Properties in George Perle's Cyclic Sets" at the Symposium on Systems Research in the Arts, on August 3rd, 2000 in Baden-Baden, Germany. This conference was sponsored by the International Institute for Advanced Studies in Systems Research and Cybernetics, in cooperation with UNESCO.
