ENMU-ROSWELL COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD PREPARES FOR MIL LEVY ELECTION

The Branch Community College Board of Eastern New Mexico University-Roswell is preparing for a special election on February 3, 2009, when voters in Chaves County will be asked to approve an additional one mil levy for the continued operations, maintenance, and capital improvements of the campus. Two new Community College Board members will also be elected on February 3-- one from District 2 and one from District 3. Ed David currently holds the District 2 position and Steve Henderson holds the District 3 position. Both were elected to two year terms, which expire in 2009. Chad Hamill and Jose Chaves are running for the District 2 position and Eloise Blake is running unopposed in District 3.

Board member, Clyde McKee, is chairing the mil levy committee, which will work to educate voters about why the additional mil levy is needed. During the December board meeting, McKee and university officials explained that the existing one mil levy paid by the college's local taxing district is required by state statute and the funds from that levy are returned to the state. The funds from this additional one mil, if approved, would stay with the university and be used to sustain campus operations and programs.

Dr. John Madden, ENMU-Roswell President, said ENMU-Roswell provides an extensive range of very specialized programs (welding, respiratory therapy, radiographic technology, engineering and design technology, emergency medical services) that benefit local residents, but are costly to maintain because they require specific equipment that needs regular replacement to keep student learning current. These programs, like nursing and automotive technology, also require highly concentrated teacher-student interaction. Graduates from these programs provide local employers with expertise and that keeps services convenient and overall costs down for consumers. McKee and Madden also said expanded construction projects are stretching campus resources to maintain buildings and keep up with rising utility costs. "This mil levy is all about future sustainability for ENMU-Roswell" said McKee.

ENMU-ROSWELL TAKES PART IN COLLEGE GOAL SUNDAY

College-bound students in Chaves County interested in federal cash assistance for their education after high school are encouraged to attend College Goal Sunday events in February. College Goal Sunday is a nationwide non-profit volunteer program that helps college-bound students and families complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). ENMU-Roswell staff will be available on Saturday, February 21 at the Roswell Adult Center from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. and on Sunday, February 22 at the Dexter High School Library from 3 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. The assistance is free. With the FAFSA, students have access to billions in federal and state funds available for college.

College Goal Sunday is a national initiative to overcome one of the main barriers to higher education – high cost. Across the country, College Goal Sunday connects students with assistance for school. While at College Goal Sunday, students and families will receive one-on-one assistance from financial aid administrators, high school counselors, and community volunteers in filling out the FAFSA and answering questions about financial aid. 

**ENMU-ROSWELL PRESENTS
INTERNATIONAL ART EXHIBIT**

ENMU-Roswell's Art Department is sponsoring an international competitive art exhibition called 'Beauty, Decoration and Ornament,' which will open with a reception on Thursday, February 12 from 4 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. The exhibition will run through March 11 in Gallery 117, located in room 117 of the Arts and Sciences Center on the ENMU-Roswell campus.

The exhibit explores artists' interpretations of the qualities of beauty and is open to works of art created by artists at any level of professional development and of any media using any process or technique. So far, entries have been received from throughout the United States and from foreign countries in areas as far away as South America and West Africa. A jury consisting of art faculty members from ENMU-Roswell will screen the initial entries to select those works of art that will be included in the exhibition. Exhibition judge, Miranda Howe, M.F.A., will make decisions from the jury-selected works of art, selecting which works of art will receive awards. Awards will include recognition for Classic Beauty, Unexpected Beauty, and Beauty as Significance. Student entries have also been sought for this competition, and at least one art scholarship award will be given to a student entrant.

The deadline for entry is January 16 at 3 p.m. for both general and student entries. Local artists who wish to enter should submit an entry form, an entry fee of \$20 and up to three entry images (35 mm slides or digital images). Student artists should submit an entry form, a discounted \$2 entry fee, proof of student status, and one work of art. ROGERS TO RETIRE FROM ENMU-ROSWELL

After 25 years of service to the Eastern New Mexico University system, Dr. Dwight Rogers, Vice President for Academic Affairs at ENMU-Roswell, has announced his retirement, effective February 1, 2009. Rogers began his career at ENMU in Portales as a faculty member and department chair in 1988. Ten years later, he accepted the Associate Dean for Career and Technical Education position at the ENMU-Roswell campus. He served in that capacity for three years and in 2001, Rogers was named the Dean of Instruction. The title changed in 2008 to Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Working at ENMU-Roswell has been a wonderful experience, Rogers said. He is proud of the accomplishments in Academic Affairs during the past seven years. New degrees have been added in Accounting, Limited Radiography, Media Arts and Film, Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning-Refrigeration (HVACR), Dental Assisting, and Dental Hygiene. The campus has welcomed the Community Band and Chorale and revitalized the Theatre Arts program. The Higher Learning Commission accredited ENMU-Roswell's online courses, which have grown from 170 students enrolled in 12 courses in the fall semester of 2001 to more than 2900 students enrolled in 140 courses in the fall of 2008. Respiratory Therapy, Emergency Medical Services, Medical Assisting, and Nursing were all reaccredited. Automotive Technology was recertified and Welding Technology was accredited for the first time. The HVACR program obtained accreditation in its third year of existence. The Federal Aviation Administration selected ENMU-Roswell as one of eight additional colleges nationwide to participate in the Air Traffic Collegiate Training Initiative program.

Rogers said he was also fortunate to play a key role in the planning and construction of several new instructional and support services facilities for the campus, including the Instructional Technology Center, expansion of the Aviation Maintenance Technology Center, phase one of the Health Science Center, and the renovation of the Campus Union Building.

"I am deeply indebted to faculty, staff, and administration, and consider myself very fortunate to have had such an interesting, challenging, and gratifying career," Rogers said. "Eastern New Mexico University-Roswell is a remarkable school and a great place to work, learn, and grow. I am truly grateful for the opportunity to work at such an outstanding university."

When did Americans first acknowledge our Presidents with their own day?

Presidents' Day dates back to our founding father and first President, George Washington. Washington was born on February 22, 1732. On his birthday in 1796, when Washington was in his last full year as president, the day became the holiday known as Washington's Birthday. However, Americans didn't observe this holiday until 1832, 100 years after his birth.

Abraham Lincoln was the next President to gain reverence similar to Washington. Born on February 12, 1809, Lincoln's birthday was first celebrated in 1865, the year after he was assassinated. Although his birthday was not honored as a federal holiday like Washington's, many states adopted it as a legal holiday.

In 1968, Congress passed legislation placing any federal holiday on a Monday, including Washington's birthday, to create a three-day weekend. In 1971, President Richard Nixon combined Washington's and Lincoln's birthdays into Presidents' Day. It would

be celebrated on the third Monday in February, regardless of which day it fell on. Presidents' Day is now viewed as a holiday that pays tribute to both Washington and Lincoln, as well as all those who have served as president.
