- 040 Tells about old clock ordered with tobacco coupons, (told by daughter, Mrs. Hillard)
- 070 First ranch in Hereford area
- 083 Ranch bordered XIT Ranch
- 101 First to Portales from Herford in 1903, came in buggy, there was terrible sandstorm which blew husband's wedding coat away.
- 137 Macy Morris - Oct. 2, 1972
daughter of Mrs. Maude Morris who is 95 yrs. old
- 148 1907: came to area, homesteaded in Red Lake Community
- 175 7 children
- 245 1921: Macy was teacher in Roosevelt County school
- 296 1930's: Dr. Pearce's drug store; Dr. practiced there, also a gift shop
- 417 Ed J. Neer: undertaker
- 450 Neighbors all helped each other when sick or building

- 001-022 Burned coal, cowchips, mesquite grubs, & corn cobs
- 045 Ate big breakfast: peach preserves, ham sauges, bacon, eggs, oatmeal, & biscuits.
- 062 Bathing and baking on Saturdays
- 098 Killing and curing meat, canning, & rendering lard described
- 130 Martha Ann (Peterson) Hatch - Oct. 2 1972, 95 yrs. old
- 134 1906: came to Roosevelt County; 7 children; homesteaded west of Doss (S.W. of Portales)
- 154 grew corn, maize, and potatoes

- 190 Ate rabbits and beans
- 220 Describes washing, ironing, and starching
- 275 Description of clother: union suit
- 310 Making lye soap
