



## Admissions Scholarships and Waivers

Application priority deadlines are Aug. 1 for fall and Jan. 3 for spring. Fill out an application to be considered for these scholarships. A FAFSA must be completed each year for initial and renewal awards. Scholarships are based on the national ACT or SAT test. Residual tests will not be used. Texas 135-Mile Waiver does not require an application.

### N.M. Freshman Scholarships

#### Freshman Academic Scholarship

\$3,400–\$6,200 per academic year

#### Criteria

N.M. resident

N.M. high school graduate or N.M. GED recipient in the semester proceeding the first semester of attendance.

Minimum score of 20 ACT or 940 on SAT

Continuation: for first semester to second semester freshman 3.0 GPA and complete 12 hours

Continuation: up to six additional semesters 3.2 GPA and 15 hours per semester (Exception – 20–21 ACT or SAT equivalent for the first year only) (credit by exam excluded)

#### ENMU Foundation Starter Scholarship

Up to \$1,000 of tuition for first semester

N.M. resident, 2.5 cumulative GPA or 20 ACT or 940 SAT

N.M. high school graduate or N.M. GED recipient in the semester proceeding the first semester of attendance.

**Note:** Students who have not graduated from an accredited N.M. high school or home school will have to complete the N.M. GED.

#### New Mexico Lottery Success Scholarship

Tuition awarded second semester

#### New Mexico Scholar Scholarship

Tuition and fees plus \$700 per academic year, excluding lab, course and housing fees

N.M. resident, graduated in top 5 percent of high school class or scored 25 or higher on the ACT or 1130 or higher on the SAT. Family income of \$30,000 or less; \$40,000 or less if more than one family member is a student in postsecondary education.

Continuation: up to three years or receipt of degree

- Maintain 3.0 cumulative GPA
- Successfully complete 24 hours each year at ENMU (credit by exam excluded)

**Note:** Students receiving the New Mexico Scholar are not eligible for the Friends of Eastern Starter or the New Mexico Success Lottery Scholarships

### Out-of-State First-time Freshman Scholarships

#### Freshman Academic Scholarship

\$200–\$3,000 per academic year

#### Criteria

Minimum score of 20 on ACT or 940 on SAT

Continuation: for first semester to second semester freshman 3.0 GPA and complete 12 hours

Continuation: up to six additional semesters 3.2 GPA and 15 hours per semester (Exception — 20–21 ACT or SAT equivalent for the first year only) (credit by exam excluded)

#### Competitive Waiver

Waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition

3.0 cumulative high school GPA and a 23 ACT or 1060 SAT score

or 3.5 cumulative high school GPA and a 20 ACT or 940 SAT score

#### Colorado Scholar Tuition Waiver

Waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition

Colorado resident and 2.5 cumulative GPA and a 20 ACT or 940 SAT Score

Continuation: up to eight semesters or receipt of degree

- Maintain 2.0 cumulative GPA, and must successfully complete 15 hours each semester

**Note:** You may qualify for a Freshman Academic Scholarship (credit by exam excluded)

#### Texas 135-Mile Tuition Waiver

Waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition

Texas resident living within 135 miles of Portales, N.M.

No application required

### Transfer Student Scholarships

#### Transfer Academic Scholarship

\$200–\$700 per academic year

3.5 cumulative college GPA

Continuation: up to four semesters depending on your award

- Maintain 3.2 cumulative GPA
- Successfully complete 15 hours each semester (credit by exam excluded)

#### Competitive Waiver

Waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition

3.5 cumulative college GPA or 3.0 cumulative high school GPA and a 23 ACT or 1060 SAT score or 3.5 cumulative high school GPA and a 20 ACT or 940 SAT score

#### Phi Theta Kappa Tuition

#### Competition Scholarship

In-state: \$450; Out-of-state: \$450 plus a waiver of the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition

Phi Theta Kappa member, 3.5 cumulative college GPA, associate's degree or minimum of 60 hours of college credit

**Note:** Proof of Phi Theta Kappa membership required. Limited scholarships given.

Continuation: up to two years or receipt of degree

- Maintain a 3.5 cumulative GPA
- Successfully complete 15 hours per semester (credit by exam excluded)

#### Texas 135-Mile Tuition Waiver

Waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition

Texas resident living within 135 miles of Portales, N.M.

#### Colorado Scholar Tuition Waiver/Transfer

Waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition

Colorado resident

2.5 cumulative college GPA

Continuation: up to four semesters or receipt of degree

- Maintain 3.2 cumulative GPA
- Successfully complete 15 hours each semester (credit by exam excluded)

**Note:** You may qualify for a Transfer Academic Scholarship (credit by exam excluded)
