New Mexico Teacher Assessments Program Update

The updated NMTA program now consists of two kinds of computer-based tests:

- **NMTA custom tests.** These tests were developed specifically for the state of New Mexico. Information and registration for these tests is on this NMTA website.
- NES® (National Evaluation Series™) tests. The NES is a nationally available teacher certification testing
 program with tests that are aligned to professionally accepted national subject and pedagogy standards. Effective
 January 5, 2015, most custom NMTA tests will be replaced by equivalent NES tests as the official tests to fulfill
 many testing requirements for New Mexico teacher licensure or endorsement. Information and registration for
 NES tests is on the NES website (the test links on this website will redirect you).

All tests in the program, both custom NMTA and NES, address areas covered by New Mexico state standards.

All NES tests and NMTA custom tests are computer-based. This means access to tests by appointment, year round examinees do not have to wait for an assigned date before testing. (Some NMTA custom tests have specific testing windows throughout the year; this information is provided in "<u>Test Selection</u>".)

For information about who is required to test, which test(s) you need to take, or who to contact if you cannot determine which test(s) you need to take, see "Licensure Requirements".

The tables below list each type of test, as well as which NMTA test a NES test replaced. You can find the passing score, other information, and links to preparation materials for each test through "<u>Test Selection</u>".
