

Note to Retirees

The Office of Human Resources would like to remind those employees who intend to retire on or before July 1, 2017, of two important cut-off dates:

1. April 12, 2017 - If you wish to be included in the Retirees Reception that takes place on Wednesday, May 3, 2017, it is imperative that you let Human Resources know by April 12. If you intend to retire and are not filling out an ERB application (IE: Alternative Retirement Plan) it is even more imperative that you contact us because we typically only know if someone is retiring when they fill out their ERB application and a termination PAN may come to HR too late. Please email Benito Gonzales at benito.gonzales@enmu.edu or call Human Resources at 562-2115.
2. ERB 60-Day processing period - Please remember that the ERB likes to have your application in at least 60-days before retirement. This includes your application, along with proof of birth (birth certificate, baptismal certificate, an application for life insurance that has been in force for two or more years, US Census Record or other evidencethat is accepted by the ERB). For example, you'll need to submit your application and supporting documents to the Office of Human Resources no later than April 30 if you plan to retire on July 1. Once the Educational Retirement Board (ERB) receives your application for retirement, it will review your application and send you information containing the final computation of your retirement benefit, a final selection of benefit and direct deposit information. This information must be returned to the ERB as soon as possible so you don't have any delays in receiving your retirement checks.
